

BASIC REQUIREMENTS TO BE AUDITABLE

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1) A food is deemed as Halal if it meets the following conditions:

- (a) The product does not contain any ingredient and/or derivatives from any non-Halal sources.
- (b) The product does not contain any ingredient and/or derivatives from animals not slaughtered in accordance to the Shariah Law.
- (c) The product does not contain any ingredient and/or derivatives that is considered as Najjis.
- (d) The product and/or ingredient is prepared, processed or manufactured using equipment and facilities that are free from contamination with Najjis; and
- (e) During its preparation, processing, packaging, storage and/or transportation, it should be fully separated from any other food that does not meet the requirements specified in items

2) STORAGE, DISPLAY & SERVINGS

All Halal food must meet the following conditions:

- (a) They should be stored in a location that is segregated from non-Halal food and/or Najjis items.
- (b) They should be displayed and served using equipment and facilities that are free from contamination with Najjis.
- (c) There must be signages indicating that the food is Halal so as to prevent it from being mixed or contaminated with non-Halal food and/or Najjis items.

TERMINOLOGY

Halal : Halal is from the term al Quran means something allowable, permissible or valid

Haram : anything that is strictly forbidden to Muslim ! Haram foods include those containing pork, alcohol, blood, dead animals, and animals not slaughtered according Islamic requirements.

Najjis: Matters that are impure according to Islamic law and fatwas.

- Dogs, pigs and their descendants or derivatives
- Halal food that is contaminated with matters that are non-halal
- Halal food that comes into direct contact with matters that are non-halal

- Any liquid and objects discharged from the orifices of human beings or animals such as urine, blood, vomit, pus, excrement and placenta
- Carrion or halal animals that are not slaughtered according to Shariah law and fatwa except for aquatic animals and certain insects
- Khamr(is liquor or any liquid that intoxicates and is prohibited) and food or beverages or items which contain or are mixed with khamr

Shariah Law : Islamic law which is a reference to

Quran: sacred text

Hadiths: practices of the Prophet, including his word and actions.

Itjma : consensus drawn from analogies (Qiyas)

Qiyas : analogies from the Quran.
